STUDY 4

When any human being is born, they become part of a family. Usually they have a mother, a father, siblings, grandparents, uncles, and aunts etc. In the same way, when we are born spiritually, we 'appear' in the centre of a great family.

Ephesians 2:19 talks of a great spiritual relationship, where God is the Father, Jesus is our older brother, and the saved souls are our brothers and sisters. This family is the church.

True, the word "church" has often been used to describe a place, the building where Christians meet. However, the most important fact is to remember that "church" is actually the congregation, the community of people who have been born again.

Jesus created the Church (**Matthew 16:18**). We are founded in Him, firmly standing in His word. This Church is also a nation (a people), the continuation of the people that God had chosen from the beginning (Israel).

In the stories of the Bible, the relationship between God and the Church is shown through examples and metaphors. This type of teaching (via examples) is very interesting as it teaches us many things by using comparison. For example, if we say that some things 'are like water and oil', then we have an understanding straight away that they don't go together, which is the total opposite of saying that something is like 'flesh and blood'.

All the jobs and duties are important in the Church. From the things that appear to be the smallest and most hidden (generally seen to be the cleaning) to the more visible jobs, (such as playing an instrument or preaching) they are all fundamental for the church to work well. Each child of God has a responsibility to fulfil, and we must be content with ours. The apostle Paul in **1 Corinthians 12** explains this subject well, so that we are left with no doubts. Part of the passage says:

1 Corinthians 12:6-7 "There are different ways God works in our lives, but it is the same God who does the work through all of us. A spiritual gift is given to each of us as a means of helping the entire church."

It's great to know that we have been chosen for a task, and that God gives us knowledge and understanding to carry it out well.

God sees each one of us as living bricks ("living stones" in **1 Peter 2:5**) who together make up the great building that is the Church. We must ask God for strength and we must put all our effort into making the Church better, day by day. This way, those who see a Church that is beautiful and united, will have a reason to marvel and worship God.
